United Methodist Church Clergy Human Sexuality / Disaffiliation Issue Update

CUMC leadership recognizes that we need to resume our review of where the United Methodist Church issue regarding clergy sexual orientation stands. The repeatedly postposed 2020 General Conference (due to COVID19) is still scheduled for April 2024 and will be the first General Conference held since the 2019 Special General Conference. At that conference, the push to change the Book of Discipline to no longer cite sexual orientation as a reason to be denied as a candidate for ordination was defeated. Since then, those supporting the effort to change the discipline have continued to explore new approaches to achieve this result.

On **Sunday**, **May 21**, **starting at 6 pm**, we will hold a second all-church information session. This session will be held in the sanctuary. We will continue the review of background material that started at the March 12 information session and provide relevant updates on the changing landscape around this issue.

At this May 21 session, there will be a straw poll of the attendees to help leadership determine whether or not it appears to be appropriate for our congregation to pursue disaffiliation in the midst of the current disruption to membership and ministry. All members of CUMC are invited to participate this information session. The more active members who attend, the easier it will be to determine the will of the congregation.

April 16 Church Conference Summary

The Church Conference was called to order at 6:01 pm by Rev. Wendy Lybarger.

Thirty-two people were in attendance from Cheviot UMC, of which four were not members.

The letter from District Superintendent Rev. Jennifer Lucas authorizing Cheviot UMC to hold a Church Conference on this date and time was read by Rev. Lybarger. The letter recommended choosing a new leadership slate based on a one church board model and authorizing Rev. Lybarger to preside over the Church Conference.

Rev. Lybarger presented a tutorial on "Church Leadership Options in the UMC: What, How, and Why." The core information was distributed to all attendees as a handout. The focus of the handout was to 1) highlight the differences between a traditional Church or Administrative Council/Ministry Council leadership model (as described in UMC BoD paragraphs 252-258) and a Simplified Accountable Structure, "One Board," or Leadership Board model (as allowed by UMC BoD paragraph 247.2); and 2) describe how the "One Board" model functions. There were two Q&A sessions during the presentation by Rev. Lybarger.

In essence, the One Church Board model consolidates all of the administrative governance responsibilities of the local church under a single board. Ministry programs and teams are unaffected by this change.

A motion to approve a One Church Board model, to be called the Leadership Board, was presented by Tom Kindervater. The motion was seconded by Sue Duebber. The motion passed with 26 votes in favor and 1 vote opposed.

A motion to approve a slate of candidates for the Leadership Board was presented by Tom Kindervater. The motion seconded by Linda Page. The candidates were: Dick Becker, Ken Boesherz, Sue Duebber, Rick Hinds, Joe Hoff, Bobbi Ostermeyer, Kathy Reeme, Emily Smith, and Tom Kindervater - Chairperson. The motion passed with 27 votes in favor and 0 votes opposed.

Rev. Wendy Lybarger declared the Church Conference over at 7:09 pm.

The leadership has affirmed our recommendation and JAM Children's Worship will suspend beginning in May.

As we have been leading children each week, we are grateful for how God has spoken into our lives and grown us to know his amazing love. Your children and grandchildren have been like sponges, absorbing His words and ways. Thank you for the opportunity to share life with them. While we might be separated for a time, they will never be far from our thoughts.
